Cancellations and No Shows - Guests

Members who make a reservation to introduce guests to play golf at the Club and then are either No Show, cancel late (same schedule as Cancellations and No Shows – Members) or sign in and play with fewer guests than they made a reservation for will be charged the appropriate guest fees.

Weekday Starting Times

Tuesdays & Thursdays - are designated days for accepting Corporate Bookings.

As much notice as possible will be given to members of any changes to the starting schedule. In any event members are well advised to contact the Pro Shop in advance to check the availability and schedule of starting times.

■ Guests - Weekdays

Each membership has WEEKDAY guest quota per calendar year as follows:

HK\$775/person - Quota A (Quota of 12 guests per year) HK\$1,075/person - Quota B (Quota UNLIMITED)

- When introducing a guest or guests, a member can choose EITHER Quota A or Quota B OR a combination of BOTH
- A member is restricted to introducing a MAXIMUM of 3 guests per membership account on each weekday
- Members can bring the SAME guest in the SAME month repeatedly WITHOUT any restriction

All guests must be registered at the Pro Shop and present their I.D. card or passport prior to the start of their round. The introducing member and all their guests should be present at the time of registration and play with their guests during the whole round.



- ♦ Quota A Restriction
- 1st quarter (Jan Mar) A maximum of 12 quota is allowed.
- 2nd quarter (Apr Jun)
 A maximum of 9 remaining quota is allowed.
- 3rd quarter (Jul Sep)
 A maximum of 6 remaining quota is allowed.
- 4th quarter (Oct Dec)
 A maximum of 3 remaining quota is allowed.

Unused quota(s) cannot be accumulated for use in later quarters.

Weekends/ Public Holidays Starting Times

Two-Tee Starting is used on Weekends and Public Holidays.

1st & 10th Tee Starting 07:07 – 08:52 11:40 – 13:25

As much notice as possible will be given to members of any changes to the starting schedule. In any event members are well advised to contact the Pro Shop in advance to check the availability and schedule of starting times.

Overseas Guests on Weekends and Public Holidays

A Gold Card Holder may sign in and play with one overseas guest on Weekends and Public Holidays (Saturday - AM, Sunday & Public Holiday - PM). Each Gold Card Holder has a quota of 6

Overseas Guest Fees per calendar year at the lower Weekend Overseas Guest Green Fee.

All such overseas guests should present their passports for registration at the Golf Clubhouse.

Gold Card Times

These times may be reserved in advance only by Gold Card Holders.

A Silver Card Holder with the appropriate Handicap Index, may reserve a Gold Card Time 15 minutes in advance of the actual time.

Swapping of Starting Times

A Gold Card Time reserved by a Gold Card Holder may not be swapped to a Silver Card Holder. Any time on Weekends and Public Holidays which has been reserved by a member may not be swapped to an overseas guest.

Early Bird Golfers

- ♦ Tee times are only available under a one-tee start arrangement
- Course Maintenance staff will have priority over golfers. If there are staff working in front of play or when any pin flag is removed from the green, members must either wait for work in progress to be completed or move on to the next hole
- A maximum of 2 players per group are allowed and only members are permitted to play
- ♦ Each player may play only one ball
- Please rake bunkers, repair divots on fairways and ball marks on the green
- ♦ Early Bird play is for 9 holes only

Any breach of the above will be referred to the Disciplinary Committee for further action.



Single Players

Single players have no standing at anytime.

Pro Shop staff will make every effort to find a single player a partner.

Single players may not play between the hours of 07:07 and 16:00 on Weekends and Public Holidays.

■ Dress Code

The Dress Code as laid down by the Golf Committee states that:

Correct golf attire should be worn on the Golf Course, Driving Range, Putting Green and in the Clubhouse including Horizons. Specifically, track suits, tee shirts, i.e. shirt without collars, vests, short shorts (tennis shorts or skirts which are more than four (4) inches above the knees), athletic and exercise shorts, and leotards are not considered as appropriate golf wear. Shirts should be "tucked in" at all times.

Jeans are allowed in Horizons' Lounge / Bar areas only, provided that they are not torn or with holes.

Either spiked or spikeless golf shoes may be worn. The Golf Committee strongly recommends the use of soft spikes.

Caps, hats and visors are recommended to be removed whilst in the Horizons Restaurant.

To save embarrassment, members are requested to follow the Dress Code.

■ Control of Play

A member must have an official Clearwater Bay Golf & Country Club golf bag tag fixed to his golf bag when using the Golf Course, Driving Range and Putting Green.



Control of play shall be in accordance with such regulations as the Golf Committee may decide from time to time, and attention is drawn to the "Etiquette" section.

All players commencing a round of golf shall start at either the 1st or 10th hole as directed by the Pro Shop or Starter and play each hole thereafter in proper sequence.

When Two Tee Starting is used, the booked starting time has priority over those who have already played 9 holes.

9-hole play on days when Two Tee Starting is used may only commence after the last flight on the starting sheet has crossed over and teed off.

Discontinuation and Resumption of Play

For your safety, in case of thunderstorm or lightning, an Electric Field Monitor Instrument is installed in the Clubhouse and will be used to evacuate the course when lightning is approaching. All players should return to the Clubhouse when the following signals are heard:

Course Closed and Play Suspended - Three consecutive notes of the siren, repeated.

Course Reopened and Play Resumed - One prolonged note of the siren, repeated.

No player shall continue play when the course is closed or resume play before the course is reopened for play. If the course closure takes place during play, players may continue their game when the course is reopened. Those starting times affected by the course closure are considered cancelled. Starting times as booked will resume, and have priority over those completing disrupted play, when the course is reopened.

Should the course be closed due to adverse weather conditions no refunds will be made.



■ Mobile Telephones and Other Sound Devices

The use of mobile telephones or any other sound devices is **forbidden on any part of the Club premises** except car parking areas and patio areas.

Mobile Phone Rules

- Mobile phones and other sound devices must be switched to silent mode at all times whilst on Club premises.
- Mobile phone usage that causes a disturbance to other members is not allowed.
- Mobile phones are only permitted at car parking areas, public phone areas and in the Marina, except BreeZes.
- Mobile phones are not permitted in restaurants, except for Oasis and Horizons terraces.
- In case of emergency, mobile phones are allowed on the golf course, but members are only allowed to use mobile phones in golf carts on the cart path and should forfeit the hole being played in order not to create slow play and cause any inconvenience to other members.

Member's Guest

Members are not allowed to bring any local guest to the Golf Club (including Horizons) during Weekends & Public Holidays.

Visitors

Visitors may book a maximum of 3 days in advance. Only White or Red Tees may be used.

Bag Storage

Any golf member who wishes to store their golf bag in the Golf Clubhouse bag storeroom must have an official number disc affixed to their golf bag.

Golf members who wish to store their golf bag in the golf bag storeroom may do so subject to the space available, payment of the appropriate fee prevailing at the time and display of an official embossed disc on the golf bag.



The bag storage fee paid is non-refundable and the bag storage space is non-transferrable.

Details are available at the Pro Shop.

■ Bag Storage Daily Charge

A daily charge of HK\$20 for golf bag storage.

Daily Locker Usage

Lockers are free of charge. However, if daily locker key is not returned on the same day, a charge of HK\$50/member or HK\$100/guest or visitor will be imposed accordingly.









COURTESY ON THE COURSE

General Disclaimer

- 1. Individuals enter the Club's premises and play on the golf courses entirely at their own risk.
- Individuals will be personally liable for any injuries or damages caused to any third party or to the Club's premises and the golf courses.
- 3. Individuals are recommended to purchase personal golf insurance to protect against any possible liabilities incurred on the Club's premises and the golf courses.

Consideration for Other Players

The players who have the honour should be allowed to play before their opponents or fellow competitors. No one should move, talk or stand close to or directly behind the ball or the hole when a player is addressing a ball or making a stroke. In the interest of all, players should play without delay.

No player should play until the players in front are out of range. Players searching for a ball should signal the players behind them to pass as soon as it becomes apparent that the ball will not easily be found. They should not search for 3 minutes before doing so. They should not continue to play until the players following them have passed and are out of range. When the play of a hole has been completed, players should immediately leave the putting green.

■ Priority on the Course

In the absence of special rules, 2-Ball matches should have precedence over and be entitled to pass any 3 or 4-Ball matches.

A single player has no standing and should give way to a match of any kind.

Any match playing a whole round is entitled to pass a match playing a shorter round.

If a match fails to keep its pace on the course and loses more



than one clear hole on the players in front, it should allow the match following to pass.

Speed of Play

Slow play will not be tolerated at anytime. Whilst Wardens and Starters are authorised to monitor the pace of play on the course, the responsibility for playing without delay rests with the players. Pace of play times notwithstanding, golfers are considered to be playing too slowly if they lose a complete hole on the group in front. Course Warden have the right to instruct slow group to skip a hole in order to make up their position on the course.

The time set by the Golf Committee is 4 hours for 18-Hole play and 2 hours for 9-Hole play. To achieve this, the following pace of play has been calculated:

Some quick tips to help speed of play:

- Be punctual for your tee-off time
- Know when it is your turn to play ready golf
- Only one practice swing per shot
- Plan your shot and select clubs as you are approaching the ball
- Bring extra clubs when you are not sure of your distance so that club selection can be made without delay
- When using a golf cart, keep the cart up with play never get in a position where you have to walk backwards to get the cart
- Move to the next tee immediately after you have completed the hole
- Position your golf equipment so that you are able to walk from the green directly towards the next tee
- Do not give instructions or lessons on the course
- Keep pace with the group ahead
- If you are playing a 4-Ball game, always allow a 2-Ball game to play through

Care of the Course

Raking Bunkers - Before leaving a bunker, a player should carefully fill up and smooth over all holes and footprints made by them. Please leave rakes outside of the bunker on the flattest part parallel to the line of play.

Replace Divots, Repair Ball-marks and Damage by Spikes - Through the green, a player should ensure that any turf cut or displaced by them is repaired at once by pouring sand into the hole, and pressing down firmly, and that any damage to the putting green made by a golf ball is carefully repaired. Damage to the putting green caused by golf shoes and spikes should be repaired on completion of the hole.

Damage to Greens - Flagsticks, Bags, etc. Players should ensure that when putting down bags or the flagstick, no damage is done to the putting green and that they do not damage the hole by standing too close to it, by mishandling the flagstick or by



removing the ball from the hole. The flagstick should be properly replaced in the hole before the players leave the putting green. Players should not damage the putting green by leaning on their putters, particularly when removing the ball from the hole.

Damage through Practice Swings

Players should avoid causing damage to the course - particularly the tees when taking practice swings, and should replace divots as required.

Ponds & Water Hazard

It is expressly forbidden to enter or walk upon the edge of any pond or water hazard.

Golf Carts

Golf Carts should stay on cart paths at all times. Notices regulating the movement of golf carts must be strictly observed.

Golf Cart Disclaimer

1. With effect from 1 January 2017, members and visitors who wish to operate a golf cart at the Golf Club shall declare their status of possession of a full driving licence in Hong Kong.

A maximum of 2 persons & 2 golf bags per cart.

Under the Road Traffic (Village Vehicles) Regulations (Cap. 374N), any person who wishes to operate a golf cart must hold a valid Hong Kong driving licence.

All members and visitors are required to abide by the current legislation for operating a golf cart at the Club by fulfilling the following requirements:

A. Members should provide a copy of their driving licence and approach the Golf Pro Shop or Country Club Reception to sign on a one-off Golf Cart Declaration Form before 1 January 2017. By signing the form, it would eliminate the need of presenting your driving licence each time when you rent a golf cart.



- B. Members are obliged to remind their guests regarding this legal requirement. All guests must present their valid Hong Kong driving licence <u>each time</u> upon check-in. Visitors to Hong Kong (visitors mean that their stay in Hong Kong will not exceed 12 months) may drive a golf cart with a valid international driving permit or domestic driving permit / licence, provided that they are 18 years old and above. No driving licence record will be held for future use.
- 2. All drivers must sign the declaration form before driving the golf cart. Personal liability is strictly the responsibility of the golf cart driver.
- 3. In the event of damage to the golf cart by a third party, the golf cart driver is solely responsible for reporting to the Clearwater Bay staff and making arrangements for compensation with the third party or else the golf cart driver will be accountable for the payment of damage.
- 4. The golf cart driver will be responsible for compensating the Clearwater Bay for damage of the golf cart.

Access to the Golf Course

Only golfers playing golf may have access to the golf course.

■ Members' Domestic Helpers & Chauffeurs

- Members' domestic helpers and chauffeurs, who accompany member and/or members' children visiting the Club, shall apply for a Domestic Helper/ Chauffeur Identity Card at a fee as the General Committee may determine.
- Domestic helpers and chauffeurs should sign in and out of the Club and carry the identity card at all times whilst on the Club's premises.
- Domestic helpers and chauffeurs are not permitted to use the facilities of the Club.



Etiquette & Safety

The enjoyment of the game of golf depends very much on all our behaviour as players and members. We are all members of the same club and should extend certain common courtesies to each other. The key issues that are consistently brought to the attention of the Golf Committee are:

- 1. Poor etiquette (e.g. not raking bunkers, rude and abusive behaviour)
- 2. Slow play
- 3. Dangerous play (e.g. hitting into the group in front)
- Players should not play until the players in front are out of range.
- Players should always alert Maintenance staff nearby or ahead when they are about to make a stroke that might endanger them.
- If a player plays a ball in a direction where there is a danger of hitting someone, he/she should immediately shout a warning.
 The traditional word of warning in such situation is "fore".

To ensure we all have a pleasant and safe environment to play in and to address some of the above issues, relevant disciplinary actions were introduced on 1 May 2003.

The following guidelines are enforced by management with the full support of the Golf Committee.

The Golf Committee **fully** endorses the concept that the player with the **lowest** handicap is assumed to be the "Captain" of the group and maintains responsibility for it.

- Poor etiquette (Examples are listed below)
 - Tardiness to the tee box. (Tee time of 08:00 means golf balls in the air at 08:00)
 - Not cancelling within the designated times
 - Not raking bunkers
 - Not repairing pitch marks
 - Not replacing divots



- Not arriving starting tee 5 minutes before tee time
- Rude and abusive behaviour (to members and staff)
- Use of mobile phones (except car parking areas and patio areas)

First offence - A warning letter will be issued - Suspension of advance booking privileges for 1 month

2. Slow play (Time clocks will be utilised - 4 hours limit)

First offence
Second offence
Third offence

- A warning letter will be issued to the group
- A final warning letter will be issued
- Suspension of advance booking privileges for 2 months

3. Hitting into group in front

First offence

- Suspension of advance booking privileges for the group for 1 month
- Referred to Membership Disciplinary Committee

- The "active" period for these warning letters will be 12 months rolling from the date of the first one.
- Disciplinary Committee has the right to override the offence if there has been past issues and bring them into consideration in handing down the disciplinary action.



DRIVING RANGE

The Driving Range is open daily between 07:00 and 20:00. The range is closed for regular maintenance from 09:30 to 11:30 on Wednesdays.

The Driving Range is an integral part of the golf course. Rules relating to the use of the Driving Range are in addition to those Bye-Laws relating to the use of the golf course.

Priority will be given to a person with a confirmed tee time on the day before their round.

At other times, guests may be introduced to the Club as stipulated in the Rules. A fee is payable at the Pro Shop but if a Green Fee is paid, there is no charge for the use of the Driving Range.

Range balls are free of charge. Under no circumstances should range golf balls be removed from the Driving Range.

Members may be requested to show their membership card when entering the Range or collecting their bucket.

Members may hit one bucket of balls, on completion of which, members must vacate the mat. Provided that no other members are waiting to practise, members who have completed their bucket may continue their practice.

Golfers under the age of 13 must be accompanied by an adult.

For the safety of golfers on the 15th Tee, 10th and 18th fairway, players MUST refrain from hitting balls over the fences.

Driving Range Staff are charged with the responsibility of ensuring that rules are followed. Members are expected to co-operate for the benefit of all users of the Driving Range.

*Hitting balls on grass and removing range balls from the Driving Range may result in suspension of Advanced Booking Privileges for 2 months.



JUNIOR GOLF

The Club's Junior Golf Development programme is based at the Clearwater Bay (CWB) Academy and is available to all members' children aged 6 and above. The programme consists of off-course and on-course coaching and covers the basics of safety, swing, chipping, pitching, putting, etc., and elementary etiquette either individually, by arrangement with one of the Club's Golf Professionals, or in groups, which are held every Friday, Saturday & Sunday on an on-going basis. Access to the Clearwater Bay Academy Practice Facilities

Children of all members aged 4 - 12 may use the Clearwater Bay Academy Practice Facilities provided that they are accompanied by and under the supervision of their parents, a member, or one of the Club's Golf Professionals.

Children of all members aged 13 - 20 may use the Clearwater Bay Academy Practice Facilities unaccompanied.

Access to the Clearwater Bay Academy

The Clearwater Bay Academy is available to all members' children aged 4 - 20 who have earned a Certificate of Competence issued by the Club upon the successful passing of a basic etiquette & skills test, conducted by one of the Club's Golf Professionals. Application forms are available upon request from the Country Store or the Club's Membership Department.

Children aged 4 - 12 who have earned a Certificate of Competence may play on the Clearwater Bay Academy provided that they are accompanied and under the supervision of their parents, a member, or one of the Club's Golf Professionals.

Children aged 13 - 20 who have earned a Certificate of Competence may play unaccompanied on the Clearwater Bay Academy.



JUNIOR GOLFERS - MAIN GOLF COURSE

Access to Driving Range, Putting Green & the Golf Clubhouse

Children of golf members aged 4 - 12 may use the Driving Range, Putting Green and the Golf Clubhouse provided they are accompanied by and under the supervision of one of their parents, a golf member or one of the Club's Golf Professionals.

Children of golf members aged 13 - 20 may use the Driving Range, Putting Green and the Golf Clubhouse unaccompanied.

<u>Please note Juniors must adhere to the standard Men's & Ladies'</u> <u>Dress Code while on Club premises.</u>

Access to the Main Golf Course

Children of golf members who wish to have access to the Main Golf Course must be registered as Junior Golfers

To register, Juniors must either be in possession of a current Handicap Certificate or play 9 Holes at the CWB Academy with one of the Club's Golf Professionals (at the members' expense) to a score of 45 or less and be able to show knowledge of the Rules and Etiquette of the game. Registered Juniors are issued with a Green Golf Bag Tag which must be attached to their golf bag. Application forms for registration as Junior Golfers are available from the Club's Membership Department.

Registered Junior Subscription

The monthly subscription payable by Junior Golfers is set by the General Committee, who shall have the absolute power to adjust the subscription fee from time to time.

Registered Junior Access to Main Golf Course

Registered Juniors aged 4 - 12 may play on the Main Golf Course provided they are accompanied by and under the supervision of their parents, a golf member or one of the Club's Golf Professionals.



Registered Juniors aged 13 - 20 may play on the Golf Course unaccompanied.

Effective from 8 May 2003, registered Juniors may play on the Golf Course at anytime on weekdays, but **only after 16:00 on Weekends and Public Holidays.**

Registered Juniors with a WHS Handicap Index of 14.9 or lower may submit a written request to the Golf Committee for permission to enter Club competitions.

Junior Rules - General

Children under the age of 4 may not be admitted to any of the Club's golfing facilities, including the Golf Clubhouse and Horizons.

Junior golfers shall have only such rights as the Committee may grant from time to time and such rights may be varied or withdrawn at any time without notice.

No child of any age, whether accompanied or not, shall be allowed on the golf course, practice green or driving range other than for the purpose of playing golf.

No Junior golfers may hire or be permitted to drive the Club's golf carts, unless they hold a valid driving license.

Junior golfers may not introduce any guest or visitor to the Club.

The Club's Professionals may only give golf lessons to a child who has access to golf facilities at that time under the Club's Rules and Bye-Laws.

If overcrowding occurs (e.g. at weekends), additional restrictions may be imposed upon the right of access to juniors. As much warning and notice as is possible in the circumstances will be given of any proposal to enforce such restrictions.



HANDICAP SYSTEM

All golf clubs in Hong Kong use the World Handicap System (WHS). The WHS provides a golfer with a consistent measure of playing ability, with handicaps calculated in the same way wherever they are in the world.

It includes a slope system that produces a WHS Handicap Index which is used when playing on any golf course in the world.

Each golf course is rated by the Golf Association and has a course rating for scratch players and a slope rating representing the degree of difficulty for players who are not scratch players.

Handicap Index

Under the WHS, the best 8 of the player's most recent 20 scores are used. These are compared to the course rating and slope rating to produce handicap differentials which are used to determine a Handicap Index. A handicap differential is the difference between a player's adjusted gross score and the course rating, adjusted for slope rating.

A Handicap Index will be issued to a player after three 18-hole scores are submitted and a revision takes place. Scores can be made up of any combination of 9-hole and 18-hole scores.

Maximum Handicaps

The maximum Handicap Index under the WHS, for both men and women, is 54.0.

■ Course Handicap

A 113 slope rating is the WHS worldwide average. It is to this value that the Handicap Index relates. A Course Handicap for any course is calculated by conversion of the WHS Handicap Index for each set of tees for both men and ladies, taking into account the difficulty and difference in the course from each tee.



A player should look up their Handicap Index in the conversion table for the tee being used to establish their Course Handicap for the day.

Course Handicap = Handicap Index x (Slope Rating / 113) + (Course Rating – Par)

When travelling away from Hong Kong the player should remember their WHS Handicap Index (or use the GHIN Mobile App to check) and use the conversion chart of the course they are playing to look up their Course Handicap. When playing a course which is not rated by the system, the player should use their Handicap Index.

Assumptions

The system is based on the assumption that:

- i. Every player will endeavor to make the best score that they can on each hole in every round.
- ii. Every acceptable round is reported regardless as to where the round has been played.
- Note: i. For an 18-hole score posting, a player must play a minimum of 14 holes. For any holes over the 14 that are not played, the golfer will post a hole score of Net Par. Net Par is a score equal to the par for the hole plus any handicap strokes the player in entitled to for that hole.
 - ii. If a player plays more than 9 holes but less than 14 holes, the player will disregard all surplus holes beyond



9 holes and post a 9-hole score.

iii. For a 9-hole score, a player must play a minimum of 7 holes. For any holes over the 7 that are not played, the player will post a hole score of Net Par (see above).

Maximum Score

By setting a maximum score on each hole for handicap purposes, the rules of handicapping ensure the occasional bad hole does not impact a Handicap Index too severely.

Maximum score for each hole played is limited to a **net double bogey**, calculated as follows:

Par + 2 strokes + any handicap strokes the player is entitled to for that hole based on their Course Handicap.

When the format of play allows, players are encouraged to pick up at their maximum hole score to keep up a good pace. For competitions, the adjustment is applied after the round. This means the score posted for the competition and the score submitted for handicap purposes could be different.

Stroke Index

The stroke index shown on the scorecard is defined as the difficulty of each hole in comparison to other holes on the same course. These are numbered from 1-18, 1 being the most difficult hole, 18 the easiest hole.

Scores in All Forms of Competition

Scores in both individual match play and stroke play, including those made in team competitions, shall be posted.

■ The Posting of Scores

Every time a golfer posts a score their Handicap Index will be revised that night and a new Handicap Index will be available the following day. Score posting is available at the posting terminal



in the clubhouse and on the GHIN Mobile App. We encourage all players to submit scores regularly to have their handicap reflect their ability.

Following the recommendation from the Hong Kong Golf Association, a player's Handicap Index on the first day of each month will be their Handicap Index for the entire month. On the first day of each month, a list with the Handicap Index of all members will be put up on the Club's notice board. Members should use this Handicap Index for all club competitions and tournaments in Hong Kong.

Discretionary Adjustment of Handicap

The Golf Committee may at their discretion adjust a handicap up or down if a player:

- 1. Does not turn in all scores; or
- 2. Does not observe the spirit of the Handicap System; or
- 3. Regularly performs better in competitions than in informal play.

■ Committee Posting a Score For a Player

If a player fails to post a score, the score may be posted by the Golf Committee without the player's authorization. In a competition, the Committee in charge of the competition may post the scores of all competitors. The Committee should notify the players that it will post the scores in order to prevent scores from being posted by both players and the Committee.

Rules of Golf & Club Competitions

The conditions of play in Club competitions that shall be as notified from time to time by the Golf Committee and in accordance with the Rules of Golf as approved by the Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St. Andrews, the U.S.G.A. and the Bye-Laws of The Clearwater Bay Golf & Country Club. It is your responsibility to familiarise yourself with these and the etiquette of the game.

Distance Measuring Device

Effective from 5 April 2010, the Golf Committee approved the use of GPS & laser measuring devices in general in-house competitions. The measuring device allowed can measure distance ONLY. Any device that can gauge or measure other conditions which might affect a player's play (e.g. gradient, wind speed, etc.) is NOT permitted. Winners of competition may be requested to show their conforming device.

Handicap Allowance

In Match Play events, unless otherwise stated, 80% of the difference between Course Handicaps is allowed.

Ties

Unless otherwise stated in the Conditions of Play, ties in Club competitions will be decided by the following: -

When all competitors commence play from the same tee, ties will be decided by countback over the last 9,6,3,1 holes played and then by countback over the first 9,6,3,1 holes. Ties will then be counted back hole by hole from the last hole played.

When competitors commence play from different tees, ties will be decided by countback over the last 9,6,3,1 holes on the score card and then by countback over the first 9,6,3,1 holes. Ties will then be counted back hole by hole from the last nine holes on the score card.



Club Competitions for Gentlemen Golfing Members

Captain's Cup (Monthly)

The Captain's Cup is a Stroke Play competition over 18 holes, which will be played in accordance with the Rules of Golf as approved by the R&A, the U.S.G.A and Bye-Laws of The Clearwater Bay Golf & Country Club. In the event of a tie with a player winning both the gross and nett divisions, the player will be awarded both prizes.

If a member has played in the Captain's Cup within a calendar year and his handicap index rises above the maximum allowed (10.4), he must continue to play in the Captain's Cup for that year, from the maximum allowed index, provided his index does not exceed 13.2.

In the event of a tie in the competition, the result will be decided by a countback. The countback procedure to be used will be:

One Tee Start

When all competitors commence play from the same tee, ties will be decided by countback over the last 9,6,3,1 holes played and then by countback over the first 9,6,3,1 holes. Ties will then be counted back hole by hole from the last hole played.

Two Tees or Shotgun

When competitors commence play from different tees, ties will be decided by countback over the last 9,6,3,1 holes on the score card and by countback over the first 9,6,3,1 holes. Ties will then be counted back hole by hole from the last nine holes on the score card.

When all competitors commence play from the same tee, ties will be decided by countback over the last 9,6,3,1 holes played



and then countback over the first 9,6,3,1 holes. Ties will then be counted back hole by hole from the last hole played.

Two Tees or Shotgun Start

For those players whose handicaps exceed the maximum handicap allowance (26.7), they are welcomed to join, however they must play with the maximum handicap allowed in this category.

In the event of a tie in the competition, the result will be decided by a countback.



The countback procedure will be:

One Tee Start

When all competitors commence play form the same tee, ties will be decided by countback over the last 9, 6, 3, 1 holes played and then by countback over the first 9, 6, 3, 1 holes. Ties will then be counted back hole by hole from the last hole played.

Two Tees or Shotgun Start

When competitors commence play from different tees, ties will be decided by countback over the last 9, 6, 3, 1 holes on the score card and by countback over the first 9, 6, 3, 1 holes. Ties will then be counted back hole by hole from the last nine holes on the score card.

Captain's Cup Final (Annually)

In addition, each player must have competed in a **minimum** number of events which is **2** in any division (including the winning month).

Players who are qualified in the Captain's Cup are only entitled to play in the Captain's Cup Final regardless of their handicap indices increase above the maximum allowed (10.4) when the tournament takes place later in the early following year, the players shall then play from the maximum allowed index.



In the event of a player who is qualified in any combination of Captain's, Chairman's or DOG's Cup within a calendar year, the player shall then be seeded in the Final either in the Captain's, Chairman's or DOG's Division depending on his current handicap index at the time of the Final Play.

In the event of a tie with a player winning both the gross and nett divisions, the player will be awarded both prizes.

In the event of a tie for the first place in each division of the tournament, a sudden-death play off will be conducted immediately after the announcement of the tie to determine the winner.

Ties in Gross Division

Players will play from the hole designated by the Tournament Director with the best gross score winning. Sudden-death until there is an eventual winner.

Ties in Nett Division

Players will play from the hole designated by the Tournament Director with the highest number of points winning. During the play off, the stroke allowance for the holes played will be in effect.

All other ties will be decided by a countback. The countback procedure to be used will be: -

One Tee Start

When all competitors commence play from the same tee, ties will be decided by countback over the last 9,6,3,1 holes played and then by countback over the first 9,6,3,1 holes. Ties will then be counted back hole by hole from the last hole played.

Two Tees or Shotgun Start

When competitors commence play from different tees, ties will be decided by countback over the last 9,6,3,1 holes on the score card and by countback over the first 9,6,3,1 holes. Ties will then be counted back hole by hole from the last nine holes on the score card.

Players who are qualified in the Chairman's Cup are only entitled to play in the Chairman's Cup Final regardless of their handicap indices decrease above the minimum allowed (10.5) when the tournament takes place early next year, the players shall then play from their Current Handicap Indices.

In the event of a player who is qualified in any combination of Captain's, Chairman's or DOG's Cup within a calendar year, the player shall then be seeded in the Final either in the Captain's, Chairman's or DOG's Division depending on his current handicap index at the time of the Final Play.

In the event of a tie for the first place in the tournament, a sudden-death play off will be conducted immediately after the announcement of the tie to determine the winner.

Ties play off

Players will play from the hole designated by the Tournament



Director with the highest number of points winning. During the play off, the stroke allowance for the holes played will be in effect based on players' course handicaps.

All other ties will be decided by a countback. The countback procedure to be used will be: -

One Tee Start

When all competitors commence play from the same tee, ties will be decided by countback over the last 9,6,3,1 holes played and then by countback over the first 9,6,3,1 holes. Tees will then be counted back hole by hole from the last hole played.

Two Tees or Shotgun Start

When competitors commence play from different tees, ties will be decided by countback over the last 9,6,3,1 holes on the score card and by countback over the first 9,6,3,1 holes. Ties will then be counted back hole by hole from the last nine holes on the score card.






